Notable German-Americans Johann Martin Henni (1805-81) -- A German-American Pioneer Priest By Don Heinrich Tolzmann

Born in Obersaxen, Switzerland, Henni came to America in 1829, and was ordained to the priesthood in Cincinnati. In 1834, he became pastor of Holy Trinity Church (*Heilige Dreifaltigkeits-Kirche*). It was the first German Catholic church in Cincinnati, and is considered the mother church of German Catholic churches in Cincinnati followed its founding, including: Old St. Mary's Church, St. John the Baptist Church, St. Philomena, St. Paul Church, St. Michael the Archangel, St. Augustine Church, Immaculata Church, St. Anthony Church, and St. Stephen's Church (later renamed: Our Lady of Victory).

Henni published a fascinating book on the German Catholics of the region: *Ein Blick in's Thal des Ohio: oder, Briefe über den Kampf und das Wiederaufleben der katholischen Kirche im fernen Westen der Vereinigten Staaten Nordamerika's* (A Look into the Ohio Valley: or, Letters about the Struggle and Reawakening of the Catholic Church in the far West of the United States of America), published in München by Franz Seraph Hübschmann in 1836. It would be a great contribution to German-American history to have this work translated into English, and explore the image it portrays of German Catholic life in what was then called the West.

Another major accomplishment of Henni's was the founding of the *Wahrheits-Freund* (Friend of Truth), the first German Catholic paper in the U.S. It was published in Cincinnati from 1837 to 1908. It is a veritable goldmine of information on German Catholics not only in Cincinnati, but regionally and nationally as well. In 1843, Henni was appointed Bishop of the newly established Diocese of Milwaukee, and not surprisingly played an important role in German Catholic life there.
