
The Roebling Suspension Bridge: A Guide to Historic Sites, People and Places (2nd Edition)

Last, but certainly not least, is the latest work by Don Heinrich Tolzmann, *The Roebling Suspension Bridge: A Guide to Historic Sites, People, and Places (2nd Edition).* Tolzmann has expanded this edition of the book, adding nine chapters that include Washington Roebling's history of the bridge, plans for the Brooklyn Bridge, and his report to the Covington & Cincinnati Bridge Company.

In 1830, Roebling co-authored a guide describing America and information about the formation of an emigration society. A year later, in 1831, he left Germany and settled in Pennsylvania.

Tolzmann, the historian for the Covington-Cincinnati Suspension Bridge Committee, has written numerous books on German-American history and Cincinnati's German heritage. His books are always well researched and thoroughly documented, his latest being no exception.
